The TOPtoTOP Global Climate Expedition is the first expedition over the 7-Seas to the 7-Summits that will be achieved by human and nature's power only. Their mission is to inspire children for a better future. Along the way they share examples of nature's beauty and innovations for a green planet, in class rooms all over the world.

TOPtoTOP is led by Dario Schwörer, a climatologist and international ski and mountain guide and his wife Sabine, a nurse. They decided to embark on this voyage when they saw the impact climate change was having in the Alps.

Their expedition is a reference to demonstrate that great goals and progress can be achieved in balance with nature. Through their voyage and interaction with school children, they hope to raise awareness about the dangers of climate change, encourage climate protection and show that one can enjoy nature through sport but at the same time give something back to nature.

With each stop throughout the expedition that Sabine, Dario Schwörer and their followers make, they take the chance to do something worthwhile, for example, assisting, organizing and helping to co-ordinate people to clean beaches or riverbeds in situations like after severe floods or violent storms.

The TOPtoTOP team is frequently joined by interested supporters throughout their expedition. They can cycle alongside or join a climbing tour or even participate in a sailing-stage on the "Pachamama" – the TOPtoTOP-Expedition sailboat. The design objective and concept of Pachamama was to develop a vessel that can operate sustainably and fully autonomously (renewable energies) with maximum safety in the toughest marine environments.



TO DATE, TOPTOTOP HAS SAILED OVER 40,000 NAUTICAL MILES, CYCLED OVER 18,000 KILOMETERS AND CLIMBED MORE THAN 400,000 METERS IN ALTITUDE. THEY HAVE VISITED OVER 50,000 SCHOOL STUDENTS AND CLEANED UP OVER 25,000 TONS OF WASTE WORKING WITH LOCAL INITIATIVES.
